Tyrrell's shine with gold haul at top awards

The corks are off and Hunter Valley gold medal-winning wines are ripe for the picking, writes John Lewis.

"SUBLIME", "outstanding" and "some of the greatest semillons in recent history", said the 2013 Hunter Valley Wine Show judges – and now wine drinkers can buy 33 of the show's 48 gold medal-winning wines.

The annual show at Singleton is widely recognised as Australia's premier regional wine competition and this year attracted 730 entries from 78 Hunter producers.

The prize list was dominated by the Pepper Tree-Briar Ridge, Tyrrell's and Audrey Wilkinson-Poole's Rock brands.

Tyrrell's claimed four trophies and seven gold medals, Pepper Tree-Briar Ridge four trophies and five gold and Audrey Wilkinson-Poole's Rock three trophies and three gold.

The chairman of judges, McWilliam's chief winemaker Jim Chatto, told the crowd on Friday that it had been a pleasure to judge the wines from the outstanding 2011 and 2013 vintages, not only from the traditional semillon, shiraz and chardonnay varieties, but also from more emerging varieties like barbera and fiano.

Four wines, the Pepper Tree 2011 Limited Release Shiraz, the Audrey Wilkinson 2006 Museum Reserve Semillon, the Tempus Two 2003 Copper Zenith Semillon and the Tyrrell's 2007 HVD Vineyard Semillon received the exceptional score of 97 points out of 100.

The judging panel, which included overseas wine expert, Tokyo-based Master of Wine and wine writer Nick Goodwin, gave trophies to 21 wines, 17 of which are currently available.
